Congratulations to our Newly Ordained Priests: Fr. Suresh M. Aind SJ and Fr. Ravi Bhushan Xess SJ.



“Abide in my love” (Jn 15, 9), is the motto of Fr. Suresh Marcus Aind, SJ, who was ordained priest by Rt. Rev. Vincent Barwa, DD, the bishop of Simdega Diocese, amidst great solemnity at the Catholic Church, Rengarih, on 18th January, the first one to be ordained in 2015 for the Ranchi Province.

Fr. Suresh Marcus Aind, SJ, s/o Mr. John Aind and Mrs. Salomi Barla, with his 4 brothers, hails from village Bheditoli, under Lathakhamhan village chapel (10 km) from Rengarih Parish. Mr. John Aind has been a catechist lifelong and is still serving as such in the Kharwagarha village chapel.

At 8.AM Sunday, in a pleasantly cool weather the faithful of Rengarih, school children, college students, religious and clergy converged on the widely spaced “Pokhra Ghar” stage which was beautifully decorated. The congregation numbered more than 2,500.

The solemnity began with an entrance dance leading the bishop and the concelebrating priests to the altar. The ceremony lasted 3 hours with plenty of devotional hymns, dances and discourses. There were 53 priests concelebrating. The Religious Sisters numbered about the same.

After the Gospel and a meaningful sermon by the bishop, Fr. Provincial, Fr. Joseph Marianus Kujur, SJ, invited the Deacon Suresh Aind, SJ, to come forward and declare his consent to be ordained priest. With an initial enquiry of consent and fidelity to the church, bishop Vincent Barwa, DD, ordained him a priest forever. The choir was excellent with melodious hymns led by Fr. Alphonse Kullu, SJ and his team.

After the Holy Eucharist a flurry of felicitation items followed which went on beyond 3.00 PM. Fr. Alois Beck, SJ, the Parish Priest, saw to it that everything like the ordination ceremony, felicitation programmes and feeding the guests and parishioners went on well and came to a good finish.



The hopes and dreams of Mr. Prakash Xess and Mrs. Rahil, the parents of Deacon Ravi Bhushan Xess, SJ came to be fulfilled. Deacon Ravi was ordained priest by His Eminence, the Cardinal Telesphore P. Toppo of Ranchi Archdiocese on 1st February, at the spacious quadrangle of St. Xavier's School, Doranda. Fr. Ravi Bhushan has one younger brother, Abhishek Xess, who has settled down.

The faithful of Doranda Parish and the Fathers and Sisters of Ranchi city assembled at the colourfully and elegantly decorated *shamianah* in St. Xavier's High School compound. There were more than 100 priests who concelebrated, more than 100 religious Sisters participated and estimated 3,000 faithful attended the ceremony.

At 9.15 AM, the Cardinal and the concelebrating priests were led by the entrance dance from three different angles to the altar. Behind the altar on the screen was the motto of Fr. Ravi Bhushan Xess, SJ, brightly and invitingly written,

“What does it profit a man, if he gains the whole world and forfeits his life?” [Mt. 16, 26]

The whole ceremony took 3 hours with its melodious and devotional hymns led by the seasoned choir master Mr. Saims and Fr. Sanjay Kerketta, SJ. The atmosphere of rapt attention and a sense of inner fulfillment prevailed through the whole ceremony as this was the only ordination in 50 years the school has produced. But I must add that there is another son of the school, Br. Angel Bilung, MC, who has joined the Brothers of the Missionaries of Charity, Kolkatta.

Fr. Ajit Xess, SJ, the Principal of the school was at the helm of the whole ceremony and steered it dexterously right from the beginning to its finish explaining every rubric of the ordination as a master of ceremony. For many it was the first time to witness the elaborate rituals of ordination.

The felicitation programmes presented by the school students depicted the life sketch of the school days of Fr. Ravi Bhushan Xess, SJ, and how he got his vocation to religious life. After them came the Jesuits in their hordes filling the whole stage dancing away before the awestricken crowd and that they can do so with *dholaks* and the Adivasi alluring songs. The elderly, the young, the Juniors, the Novices and the Candidates, all were there. A good vocations promotion!

The food was served to more than 3,000 Religious and laity. St. Xavier's Community bore the burden of all this. They deserve our congrats. The St. Xavier's community Fathers and Brothers played a vital role in hosting this mega ceremony because without their shouldering it, it would not have been a big day for all us.

DIASPORA

Rome

After two weeks of Christmas vacation, the Gregorian University resumed its regular classes on 7th January. During the lunch break, the entire University community exchanged the traditional New Year best wishes with the sparkling wine offered by R.P. Rector. In a few words, he expressed his hope of seeing a more vibrant and active University community during the New Year. 22nd January was the last day of the First Semester classes. Edwin and Kulwant dedicated their time and energy to prepare themselves for the First Semester exams during the Christmas break. Edwin submitted the required written assignments on time and was relatively relaxed when the exam fever was running high for the others. To celebrate his first Ordination anniversary, he was glad to spend half a day as a pilgrim with Biju Sebastian (DUM) at Nettuno, the place of martyrdom of St. Maria Goretti. Kulwant had registered himself for 9 courses and so had to slog hard for 9 exams. By the end of January, he was content to have completed half of the exams with flying colours. After the exams, he will go along with other members of the community to Venice for a few days. He has managed very well to combine his studies with his new assignment as the Coordinator of the community life.

In addition to their seriousness in studies, Edwin and Kulwant have always some innovative and creative ideas and plans, which they bring out with sweet surprises. When Justin and Linus were out for the Christmas ministries in the Parishes of North Italy, they had organized a Christmas *Milan* for those staying back at home during Christmas on 26th December. For the New Year, they had a bright idea of inviting the Ranchi Jesuits in Rome on 4th January for a Holy Mass in the Room of St. Ignatius. Edwin, our youngest priest, presided over the Eucharistic celebration. The Holy Mass in Italian, homily in Hindi and hymns in Saadri gave a real international flavour to the celebration. Within six months, Edwin seems to have picked up very well the fundamentals of the Italian language.

Justin left for Manila on 11th January as one of the members of the Vatican Radio team to cover the proceedings of the Papal Visit to the Philippines. He shared some of the important news and views from

Manila through a special bulletin. He remained there until 2nd February to prepare the necessary papers for his further studies.

One of the important events during the past two months was our personal meeting with Pope Francis. Immediately after the publication of *Evangelii Gaudium*, there was a rush to read, interpret and interrogate the text to understand the ideas, thinking pattern and position of the Holy Father Pope Francis on diverse issues ranging from the Church, Evangelization, Life and Testimony of Faith, Interreligious Dialogue to the current Social issues. The Department of Moral Theology of the Gregorian University organized a Round Table Conference in January to analyze the text of the Papal Exhortation from theological, philosophical and social viewpoints. The public response to the Conference was overwhelming. Later, Professors from different Departments wrote articles on issues raised by the Holy Father in the Exhortation. I contributed on the theme *Ecological Imprints in Pope Francis' Thinking*. All the articles came out in a book form.

After the publication of the book, we were surprised to receive an invitation from the Holy Father for a Private Audience on Thursday 4th December. We had a profoundly touching, inspiring and enriching meeting with him in his residence Casa Santa Marta. What was most inspiring and touching was his simplicity and cordiality, which made us feel at home immediately. He just walked in without any *taam-jhaam*, greeted each one of us warmly and sat in a circle like one of us. He spent one full hour with us, listening to us and sharing his own ideas, reflections and vision of the Church, Sacraments, Formation of the Priests and Religious, Interreligious Dialogue, Fundamentalism and some of the burning current social issues.

During the First Semester, the Department of Moral Theology is offering an interdisciplinary course on *Evangelii Gaudium*, which also symbolizes our serious efforts to understand, interiorize and follow the teachings of a Pope, who seems to be prophetic, visionary and revolutionary. Now with the prospect of his Encyclical on Ecology coming out in June, our Department has already initiated the process of organizing another Round Table Conference to discuss the ecological questions

from the point of view of Pope Francis. Right from the first day of his Pontificate, he has been continuously and consistently expressing his views on ecological issues connecting them with faith, justice and peace. I am coordinating the group of 12 interdisciplinary Professors to organize the forthcoming Conference. We have already completed two rounds of fruitful discussions and reflections and the next meeting is scheduled for 13th March. We do hope that the group will present a profound and panoramic view of the “green and poor-oriented thinking” of Pope Francis based on serious discussions, studies and research.

Cairo, Egypt

The New Year morning Solemn Holy Mass for the Jesuits in Cairo was blessed with the presence of the Catholic Patriarchs and Bishops of various rites (Coptic, Greek Catholic, Byzantine, Maronite, Chaldean, Armenian, Latin and others) followed by a festive dinner. This tradition is being followed since years. After being transferred to Cairo, this was a golden opportunity for me to meet them all personally.

On 3rd January, I received a Jesuit from Austria with his eight members' lay group working in Romania among street children and the less privileged. That very time, I had a friend from Malta. While taking them around Cairo for a full day visit I was able to share with them about my work in Egypt. The day was concluded with an evening Holy Mass in our Novitiate community. On 8th January I gave a second TV interview for half an hour in English. Copts have their Christmas on 7th January so the topic was about the “Joy of Christmas season”. On 11th January, families of the Jesuits were invited for a Holy Mass and an agape meal. The Near East Provincial was the main celebrant.
