## Parting Message from Provincial

At the end of my tenure in the office of the Provincial of Ranchi Jesuit Society, while I congratulate and wish all the best to my successor, Fr. Ajit Kumar Xess, I sincerely thank every province man for his support and collaboration all these years. It has been a pleasant and happy journey together towards tomorrow in spite of stress and strain due to various historical, socio-economic and political developments. I take this opportunity to thank my socii, consultors, curia members, commission heads, rectors, superiors, directors of works, parish priests, collaborators, catechists, support staff, cooks, drivers, gardeners, and so on – past and present – for their guidance, accompaniment, support and understanding.

I thank Most Reverend Father Superior General of the Society of Jesus for placing his trust in me despite my inadequacy and unworthiness, to take God's mission forward. It has been a joyful experience to work with the powerful legacy of the Society with all its dimensions – spiritual, intellectual, pastoral, social, temporal, human, etc. The legacy will continue calling for transparency, accountability and integrity. I am happy and proud that in my successor, the Province is in safe hands.

There have been experiences of consolations and desolations, struggles and strains. However, whatever we have tried to do together is in the direction of striving for the betterment of our life and mission in the midst of manifold challenges.

The present situation in Jharkhand is better than before. We can now take a sigh of relief. However, hostility continues at different levels. Investigations of the minority institutions concerning F.C.R.A. continue. If there is a routine screening, there is no issue. However, if only the Christian institutions are singled out, there seems to be a bias and a well-

thought-out design. Although Sister Concilia is out on bail, Fr. Alphonse Aind, SJ, continues to languish in jail. Fr. Stan Lourdsamy, SJ, is not yet out of danger of being arrested. Meanwhile, the threat of Citizenship Amendment Act 2019 (CAA), National Population Register (NPR) and National Register Citizenship (NRC) is real. From 1 April 2020, NPR was supposed to have started. Various Adivasi groups, Muslims, the poor and Church organizations oppose it as this process is perceived as pausing threat to their very existence as 'citizens' in the country. Ranchi Jesuits continue working courageously in Assam Mission, the Andamans, Egypt, Africa, Guyana, Cambodia and Rome in overseas missions, and also in the Common Houses of JCSA in Vidya Jyoti Delhi, Satya Nilayam Chennai and Sitagarha Tertianship. This is the context in which Ranchi Jesuits are working at the moment.

I am full of gratitude to God for guiding me all along. The first year was a period of learning and getting used to the work of the office. Thereafter, too, it was a learning process. I have learnt a lot during these years and I am still learning.

All along, I experienced that the office of the provincial was a sacred seat, entrusted to me by the Society of Jesus to carry out the Mission of God – of Peace, Justice and Reconciliation. There was never a moment during these years that my eyes were off this focus. I felt that God's hand was right there in all that we did together. There is a feeling of self-satisfaction that we were doing God's work and not ours and it was God who was taking care of the Province in the midst of many challenges.

Being in the office of the provincial, it was a consoling experience to be exposed to the universal society – through various zonal and JCSA meetings, colloquium of the new provincials in Rome, 36th General Congregation, reading about the happenings in the Society in various parts of the world, Re-orienting for Greater Apostolic Effectiveness (REGAE), Universal Apostolic Preferences (UAPs), Province Apostolic Planning (PAP), etc.

I felt a strong sense of bonding with the entire Society and the Province, dealing in cura personalis and cura apostolica. I felt one with the Jesuits slogging day in and day out in the remotest of the villages. I was part of their joys and sorrows. This gave me great consolation and solace.

I have a feeling of happiness and satisfaction for being able to work hand-in-hand with various dioceses during the last six years. Our relationship with the dioceses was all time high. Bishops entrusted me with the responsibilities of animating the religious and faithful on socio-political and religious issues. On many occasions I was the chairperson and/or resource person in the meetings of the Bishops and C.R.I (Catholic Religious of India). This relationship with the Bishops gave me a feeling of 'thinking with the Church'

and supporting the Church when she needed our help. I am grateful to the JHAAN Bishops' Conference in general and to the Archbishop's House in particular, including the Cardinal emeritus.

The unfulfilled dreams will surely be fulfilled in the years to come in the areas of (1) implementation of the Universal Apostolic Preferences (UAPs) & Province Apostolic Planning (PAP), (2) depth – spiritual, intellectual and human – in our life and mission, (3) financial stability, (4) just wage to collaborators, (5) strengthening and deepening ministries – (a) quality but cheap education – primary, secondary, inter-mediate and higher/professional – including a new degree college in Gumla, and University status to XISS and St. Xavier's College Ranchi, (b) socio-pastoral, (c) socio-political research, analysis and advocacy, (d) youth empowerment through spiritual & career guidance, skill training and social consciousness, (e) creation and consolidation of civil society in Ranchi, (f) strengthening and expansion of alumni, collaborations and networks, (g) pioneering periphery missions, (h) vocation promotion, especially of religious brothers, and (i) holistic formation.

I believe that every Jesuit must move on and not be stagnant. He should be part of the process and not occupy space. I am convinced that no one is indispensable. The time now has come for me to move on to whatever the Lord wants of me. Once again, my thanks and best wishes to one and all! God bless us all! God bless Ranchi Province!

**Manresa House, Ranchi: April 2020**

With the commencement of the Lenten Season some of the community members shared their love and compassion with the fellow brethren. On the 1<sup>st</sup> March, the first Sunday of Lent, Br. Blacius Tigga our Minister along with some other brothers from Ranchi paid a visit to the old and the sick at St. Stanislaus College, Sitagarha. On 6<sup>th</sup> March, Br Blacius Tigga, Fr. Clement Ekka, Fr. Alex Tirkey, Fr. Cyprian Ekka, Sr. Lucy and some scholastics participated in the funeral ceremony of Fr. Geoff at Sitagarha, Hazaribagh.

The arrival and departure of some distinguished persons: Mr Matthias Strelow, Homeopathic Doctor, from Germany arrived here on 1<sup>st</sup> March. He stayed with us for couple of days. He wanted to have a feel of tribal people, their culture and the way of life. He visited Sarwada and was

much impressed by the place and people over there and by the works accomplished by J. B. Hoffmann in the past. He also visited some other places like Bero and the village of Mr Simon Oraon. While leaving for Bali, he expressed his gratitude to Manresa Community for the warm hospitality he received. Fr. Rinald D'souza, S.J. who is doing his doctoral studies in Belgium arrived here on 3<sup>rd</sup> March for his research work. Fr. Xavier Lakra, S.J., the PDD of Assam Mission, who was recuperating here after his operation, was declared fit and so he left for his mission land on March 5, 2020. Due to Covid-19 crisis, schools and colleges were closed. This had impact on our institutions too. As a result, Deacons from Delhi and philosophers from Pune had to come back to the Province. They reached on 19<sup>th</sup> March.

**Meetings:** On 16<sup>th</sup> March, Budget Session 2020 was held in Manresa House for Ranchi Zone. Rectors, superiors, treasurers and directors of the works were the participants of the meeting. It began at 8.00 A.M. and came to an end at 2.00 P.M. Manresa House hosted another meeting of Jesuits on 19<sup>th</sup> March. This meeting was held in view of sound understanding of NPR, NRC and CAA. Mr Gladson Dungdung, a social activist and human rights worker, was the chief speaker. Our community also had a couple of meetings to plan and discern how we could keep ourselves and others safe from Covid-19 and how we could collectively collaborate with state government at the time of Covid-19 crisis.

**Spiritual Ministry:** On 8<sup>th</sup> March, some of our fathers generously gave their time to hear confessions at Loyola Ground where Charismatic Retreat was going on. Fr Aurel Brys conducted Seminar cum retreat from 11<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> March at Sitagarha for those involved in Dalit Apostolate.

**Vocation Promotion:** All of us are aware that the Society needs Jesuit Brothers for our apostolate and ministries. Brother Telesphore Horo is working hard in this line. On March 4, he went to St. Mary's Samtoli to conduct vocation camp for brothers' candidates.

**Health News:** Fr. Fabian Bhuinya came back from Seva Nilaya, Aara Gate on 2<sup>nd</sup> March after recovering and regaining his strength. The country wise lock down due to Covid-19 crisis forced Seva Nilaya to close down. Therefore, Fr. Benjamin Lakra also had to come back to Manresa House. Now he is recuperating at Manresa House Infirmary.

## Foregin Mission Munich, Germany

Sch. Sameer completed his first month in his new Community, Gonzaga. As per his impression, he said that the month was good. Everything was normal again but not for a long time. Covid-19 started to spread like a wildfire in Germany too. Whatever we had planned for community for the next months could not take place. We were supposed to go to Innsbruck, Austria for our community holidays, but due to Covid-19 we had to cancel the program. We had community holidays in our Community itself. On 24th March both of us shared our experiences of living in Germany with the community members. Sch. Jovilton from Goa Province also joined us. It was a good opportunity for us to reflect upon our experiences in Europe in the last three and a half years.

Here in Germany, colleges, schools and universities and shops were closed from the middle of the month. Due to Corona Virus we had to bring some changes in our community schedules and structures. A meeting was held as to how and what changes we were going to make in the community. One big change was in the celebration of the Holy Mass. We no longer have Mass in our chapel but in the dining hall, where we have more space. There is a Jesuit companion who has taken the initiative to disinfect the handles of the doors and windows everyday. We have broken contact with the bigger community, Berchmanskolleg, where the elderly Jesuits stay, in order to keep our elderly Jesuits safe. There are many other similar changes brought in the community and we were quick enough to adjust to those changes. The number of the people affected in Germany today on 8. April is 1,07,375. There are 3,500 cases in Munich alone. The government has taken preventive measures. At present we are staying mostly at home. We are also free to go out for jogging or for a walk. One can go outside alone or with family members living in the same house. Good thing is that people are cooperating very well.

We also got Fr. Christoph Soyer S.J. (also the PCF) as a new Superior for our Community. Fr. Jan Roser S.J., who was our Superior, was appointed the Vice-Provincial (with all the powers of a Provincial) of the German Province. The German Province felt very much the lack of Fr Provincial's presence since the Provincial Johannes Siebner S.J. was admitted in the hospital due to his illness. Despite all the tumult outside and within, we are continuing our normal community life in a creative way. Wish you all a blessed Easter!

## Life amidst Lockdown in Rome

The first case of COVID-19 in Italian soil was confirmed on 31 January 2020 when two Chinese tourists in Rome tested positive for virus; which resulted into the immediate suspension of all flights to and from China. A week later, an Italian man repatriated back to Italy from Wuhan was

confirmed positive. Since, the more cases were being identified in northern regions, they were placed under quarantine. As a precautionary measure, all the schools, colleges and universities were closed on 5 March 2020 as a preventive measure against the spread of COVID-19; and on 9 March, the entire country was put under lockdown. In the beginning people struggled to come to terms with their strange new reality; however, as the number of contagions and deaths increased, gradually people understood the seriousness of the situation. The feeling of uncertainty and claustrophobia replaced the sense of living in an orderly society protected by the spectacular technological developments of recent times, and people accepted the lockdown not as an order from the Government, but as their own responsibility. As the country struggled to cope up with a steep surge in the number of deaths, especially in the northern regions, a real unity started to emerge in the country's shared sacrifice.

After the suspension of all didactic activities in Gregorian University, the Scholastics of International College of Gesù immediately took precautionary measures to protect themselves and the others. The Room of St. Ignatius and the Church of Gesù were closed to the public. Within the community, the seating position in the Chapel, in Dining Hall and in all common places were rearranged in order to maintain a safe social distancing of one meter. For any emergency, one has to carry a Self-Authorized Letter indicating an indispensable reason to go out of the main entrance. More time was devoted to prayers and adorations to show solidarity with all the victims of the virus and with those medical personnels taking care of the victims and the dying. During these quarantined days, Gesù courtyard has become a crucial place for physical activities. In addition, they have a few recreational activities like dominoes, cards, poetry, ping-pong, chess, football-table, theology café, etc. More than one month has passed, and so far no one in the community has shown any symptom of corona-virus.

Collegio Bellarmino, the community of Kulwant celebrated Easter together probably for the first time in its history. We are all at home and are celebrating Easter in the Community – perhaps for the first time in history. In fact, since the closure of Gregorian University from 5 March, no one was allowed to go out anywhere. All are attentive and taking good safety measures to stay away from the Corona Virus. As a result, so far no one is infected by the Virus. During the lockdown, the students were kept busy by the Professors through Online lessons, reading materials and assignments. The same method will continue even after Easter holiday. With regard to exams, the Faculty of Canon Law in Gregoriana will follow the decision of the State Government and the Authorities of the Pontifical Universities. However, Kulwant and his Canon Law companions have been asked by their Dean to be ready for the final exam which could be held in the month of June as per the original plan; otherwise, they will have to be ready for September.

After the suspension of the regular classes, the Professors of Gregorian University started exploring different viable means to keep up the pace. The Forum Online and the Virtual Office were useful even during the regular class days; however, Google Meet and Zoom Online Sessions became handy to cater to the urgent needs of continuing the lessons. The complete lockdown from 9 March strengthened the community bond and enhanced the spirit of collaboration not only in the academic field, but also in carrying out the house chores. In the absence of the Co-workers, all came together to extend their helping hands in running the house while always maintaining the strict social distancing. The mid-day Adoration became the center of day-to-day activities and a deeply shared gesture of solidarity with the worldwide victims of the virus. The empty University and the vast terrace came as the great blessings to the community members for the physical exercises without stepping out of the campus. The Holy Week's liturgies, celebrated within the community in a very sober manner, were dedicated to all the faithful, who stayed at home to participate virtually in the Online liturgical celebrations in different parts of the world.

Finally, the words of Kulwant resonate the sentiments of Ranchi Jesuits in Rome, who appreciates the paternal and proficient guidance of Rev. Fr. Joseph Marianus Kujur S.J., in leading the Ranchi Jesuit Society to render a wonderful service to the needy at this moment of great difficulty, uncertainty, and panic in Jharkhand. The video of the valuable services rendered to the poor in Dorea, Tamar, shared and posted on Social Media, are indeed inspiring and touching – a magnanimous gesture of "Walking with the Poor". Best Wishes and Easter Blessing to All back home for the wonderful work being done for the poor and the needy.
