Integrating Socio-Pastoral Ministry: Makunda Experience (891) By Michaelsj on 20-March-2013

Ranchi, March 20: It was in May 2012, I requested Fr. Lalit Tigga s.j. the Parish Priest of Patrachauli to give me a village, where I could get positive response from the villagers on micro watershed management. After looking into the list of his villages, Fr. Lalit finally suggested the name of Makunda, a village in Itki Block with 156 house-holds, 40 of which belong to the Roman Catholic Church, 35 CNI and the rest Sarnas and a few Gop families. In the first meeting, which was shortly arranged, villagers came and shared their patterns of livelihood. From the farmers perspective of Jharkhand, the villagers were good agriculturists, particularly, in vegetable growing. They concentrated in vegetable cultivation and sold in the nearby markets,

which are well linked with the cities of Eastern India. Upon enquiring as to what their main problem was, they replied in unison that the small rivulet flowing nearby their fields was the life line for their livelihood. One old check dam, which was constructed way back in the 60s by the help of Patrachauli parish was badly damaged. For their paddy cultivation, the only source of irrigation was no more and the production had suffered significantly. For the winter crop, they wished another check dam could be constructed. The villagers committed themselves to form a committee to supervise the village mobilization and cooperation.

On the question of Corporate Social Responsibility, XISS then contacted Hindustan Petroleum Chemical Ltd. in Mumbai office which agreed to fund the project which had peoples contribution in terms of labour apart from the capital requirement. Within six months before the rains the first check dam was completed and was ready for the monsoon. People were overjoyed to see how the spill way managed to irrigate around 100 acres of paddy land. Within the next six months the second dam to got ready as the villagers put all their effort. It too got ready for the winter crop. Farmers in Makunda normally irrigate their vegetable cultivation through their earthen well dug in their fields. Having added water from the check dam not only increased number of acres of the cultivated land but also helped to raise the water level in the nearby wells. Fr. Joachim Dungdung defended his doctoral thesis. (892) By Michaelsj on 24-March-2013



Bardih:: Jubilee! Jubilee! It is a gracious and remarkable day for Fr. Placidus Lakra, SJ who completes fifty years of his Priesthood today. Born on April 18, 1928 in Murumkela (now a separate parish from Tongo) Fr. Placidus, (85) is hale and hearty in Bardih Parish. Given his age, he is really a gifted person in many ways. He is quite cheerful despite the difficult situations in a place like Bardih.

There was a simple Thanksgiving Mass in his name this morning. He was ever calm and composed in the Mass silently thanking God for his marvelous gift of everything. Hopefully there will be some special Jubilee celebration! Congratulations Dadu! and wish you a good health in your life journey ahead.

Fr. Placidus Lakra was ordained on March 25, 1963 at St. Marys Cathedral Ranchi together with other eight Jesuits of which, he recalls, four were Adibasis. He studied in St. Johns High School, Ranchi and joined the Society of Jesus on June 20, 1951. Long years of Jesuit formation (12 years in his case) was over and he was finally ordained. Just after his ordination he was sent to Kunkuri for a year. After a year, he was sent for Tertianship. He did his B.Ed in Bombay in the year 1966. He took his Final Profession in the Society of Jesus on February 2, 1967. In his fifty long years as priest, he rendered his valuable service in many places-Kunkuri being one of his important mission places. Majhatoli, Gangutoli, Jalpaiguri, Kanke, Lohardaga, Noadih, Soso, Rengarih and Bardih. He served the society both as an educationist and as a pastor for long years. Out of his experience he shares, He was sent to Jalpaiguri on 1 January 1981 only for two years but he had to stay there for eight years. He served as a Headmaster of Malbazaar School, Jalpaiguri.

Life in Gangutoli with diocesans he recalls, had been a good experience to work with. When asked about any of his bitter experience in the Society of Jesus he says, A bad reputation (record) once you get in the society, you never get a chance again to prove yourself. Life with good and bitter experiences goes on. Well done Dadu! Congratulations once again and Happy Jubilee.

Malbazar was the most difficult mission but very rewarding! he shared when he was asked yesterday about his priestly life. In his receding life he has been in Mission stations like Rengarih (9 years) and now in Bardih (now for 6 years) as JWT- Jesuit
