The ordination of Deacons Anuj Minj and David Minj to priesthood took place at 8.15 am on Sunday on 12 January 2020, at the Catholic Church, Tongo. The ordaining bishop Rt. Rev. Paul Lakra, DD, was accompanied by 135 concelebrating priests. There were some 95 religious sisters from different congregations and the faithful numbering at about 4000. Jesuits from different communities made their presence visible including the Pre-Novices and the Novices from ATC, Namkum and some 5 Coadjutor Brothers; the whole congregation was eager to witness the solemn ceremony.

It was a bright sunny day but the chillness of winter was still lingering on sending shiver among the attendants. Despite this the cheerfulness was unhampered. The entrance dance from two sides converged to the altar preceding the array of concelebrating priests who solemnly walked up to the podium behind the bishop. The faithful occupied their place on the East, West and the North of the altar. The three hour ceremony draped the congregation with melodious music and hymns accompanied by sweet *Mandar beat, octopad and kartal* helping a strong male and female voice a well tuned melody. All attention and focus directed towards the altar to observe the different rituals of ordination – for some being the first time and for others reenacted many a time once again. The school children, in their colourful dress dancing, briskly moving about, were a delight to see. The Mahila Sangh and the Catholic Sabha leaders were alert that the things went on according to plan. The Ursuline Sisters of Tongo managed, directed and helped in every way that the event ended with a fine tuned note of satisfaction and appreciation by the gathering.

The pastorally oriented homily of Bishop Paul Lakra was direct and in tune with the people who listened in rapt attention with smiles and approval in between. The homily runs thus: From the Holy Bible that was read out about the holy works of God. From the Gospel according to St. Mathew we heard that John the Baptist was baptizing the people, purifying the people, Jesus was also in the queue to get baptized. When baptized by John the Holy the Holy Spirit proclaimed: ‘This is my beloved son with whom I am well pleased.’ It was a joyous moment. Jesus cured the sick, raised the dead and to cleanse us from our sins he sacrificed his life on the cross. The same task Jesus is entrusting to us who are ordained already and getting ordained today.

The ordination of deacon Jyoti Paul Baxla, SJ, was held at 8.00 am, on 14 January 2020 at the Virgin Mary Mother of the Poor Church, Banabira, Simdega Diocese.

Rt. Rev. Bishop Vincent Barwa, DD, lead the ceremony along with 42 priests concelebrating. There were 20 religious Sisters from different congregations and the faithful of some 2000. Banabira Parish is located 50 kms away from Samtoli Parish, Simdega, to the West close to the jungle in the North-West, leading to Jokari and Majhatoli Parishes in Gumla Diocese. The parish was founded in 1940, and since then it has been serving the people in strengthening their faith, reaching education to every home and motivating economic growth strongly.

The atmosphere was calm and composed. The faithful eagerly congregating at the venue, taking their place in an orderly manner, no hassle of any kind, no need of any volunteer to guide or direct, all the children and the elderly occupying a suitable place available and waiting for the ceremony to begin. Everyone had in mind that it was the holy ceremony. The choir composed of school children, teachers, St Anne's Sisters, the priest Headmaster at the head conducting it, all were in the best gear, singing sweetly, swaying their body, music melodious, everything fitted to the occasion.

His Lordship Vincent Barwa, DD, delivered a homily persuasive and instructive to the audience, explaining about the grandeur and importance of the priesthood of Jesus as well as that of the ordinandee. He continued, "A priest is a gift to the family and the church. He receives the life of Christ. Jesus said, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me." He shares with every priest the Holy Spirit. Without the Holy Spirit our life is incomplete. The will of God is that we look for the life of the Spirit and live in it. In our trouble and difficulties the Holy Spirit helps us to overcome

The ordination of Deacon James Peter Balmuchu, SJ, son of late Mrs. and Mr. Scholastica Ekka and Arsen Balmuchu, was held at 8.00 am on Sunday, 19 January 2020, at St Aloysius Church, Mandar, at a gathering of 3000 faithful. His Grace Felix Toppo, SJ, the Archbishop of Ranchi Archdiocese, ordained him priest along with some 78 concelebrating priests, mostly Jesuits, and a few Jesuit Co-adjutor Brothers present and some 50 Religious Sisters witnessed the ceremony. The weather was very threatening to have the ceremony in the open air upon a beautifully decorated platform made ready for the occasion or in the church. The Parish Priest was in a great dilemma between the open air stage outside or in the Church. At one time he directed the St. Anne's Sisters to prepare the altar in the church as it was still drizzling till 8.00 am. Earlier there was a considerable amount of shower for more than one hour and the sky was overcast. The Providence guided the Parish Priest and the decision was to have it outside. There was no drizzle or rain any more the whole through the ceremony. A sigh of at ease for all! The ordination rites and the Holy Eucharist solemnly went on for 3 hours.

In his homily His Grace Felix Toppo, SJ, instructed the faithful in these words: Today we are celebrating two great events, namely, the Holy Eucharist and the Priestly Ordination. If seen ordinarily they are just a prayer event and a social office ceremony. But if seen supernaturally, they will be the Jesus' sacrifice of salvation on the cross and a God's anointing of his chosen one. Ordaining bishop is just a representative of God.
